Impact and Objectives

The yearly internal conference is a special event that focuses on a topic of great importance to FilmEU's operations. It offers a conducive environment for team members to develop activities and enhance their knowledge. Whenever needed, experts in relevant areas are invited to participate in discussions.

Every year, the conference focuses on a specific topic that aligns with the Alliance's activities and ongoing tasks. The thorough examination of pedagogical strategies, mobility dynamics, and the field of artistic research demonstrates the dedication to promoting intellectual development and innovative exploration.

HOW TO BUILD A EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY (2021)

The Event

The first FilmEU Summit, held in Lisbon, was an extraordinary milestone for the Film and Media Arts Alliance. It marked a significant moment in the alliance's history, bringing together students, educators, researchers, and experts from across Europe in the field of Film and Media Arts.

Gathering in person for the first time since the alliance's inception, participants experienced the power of face-to-face interactions, networking, and learning opportunities [[Link](#)]. The first FilmEU Summit was hosted by Lusófona University (Portugal), between the 21st and 23rd of September 2021 (Fig. 1).

The program took place over four days and was filled with engaging sessions, discussions, and networking opportunities. Participants went on an intellectual journey covering a wide range of themes and activities, ultimately contributing to the enhancement of the FilmEU Alliance's mission.

The first day set the tone for the summit with the FilmEU_RIT Kick-off presentation, followed by a screening session of student short films.

The day two began with the Academic Council closed session. The FilmEU conference renowned keynote speakers, such as Anna Valtonen and Maria Silvia Gatta, explored the cultural and creative sectors' role in post-COVID Europe. With Manuel José Damásio as moderator, participants delved into the challenges and opportunities facing the industry.

Also, the pedagogical strategies/ Samsara Model for the future FilmEU activities were presented by Érica Rodrigues, Marc Van De Walle, Linda Carroll, and Jodie Baltazar.

On the third day, the FilmEU team presented their ongoing work to their colleagues, specialists, and stakeholders. The working day was lengthy, but it allowed for in-depth discussion of the tasks accomplished and the next steps to be taken (Fig. 2/3).

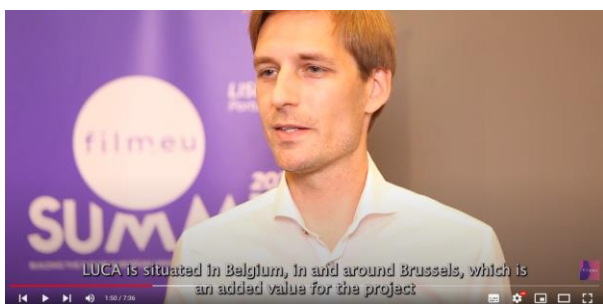

QUALITY ASSURANCE FRAMEWORK FOR FILMEU (2022)

The event

On 23rd February 2022, FilmEU promoted the second yearly internal conference, entitled “Quality Assurance Framework for FilmEU”. This event marked a significant milestone in the alliance's ongoing efforts to enhance the quality of education, research, and innovation in the field of film and media arts across Europe (Fig. 4).

The main objective of this internal conference was to present the first draft of the potential Quality Framework that will be developed in the context of the FilmEU Alliance. The event was an opportunity to demonstrate the work in progress and provide the team with an environment of discussion around the theme. The framework is being designed to uphold and enhance the excellence of FilmEU programs while fostering collaboration and harmonization across the alliance's diverse institutions.

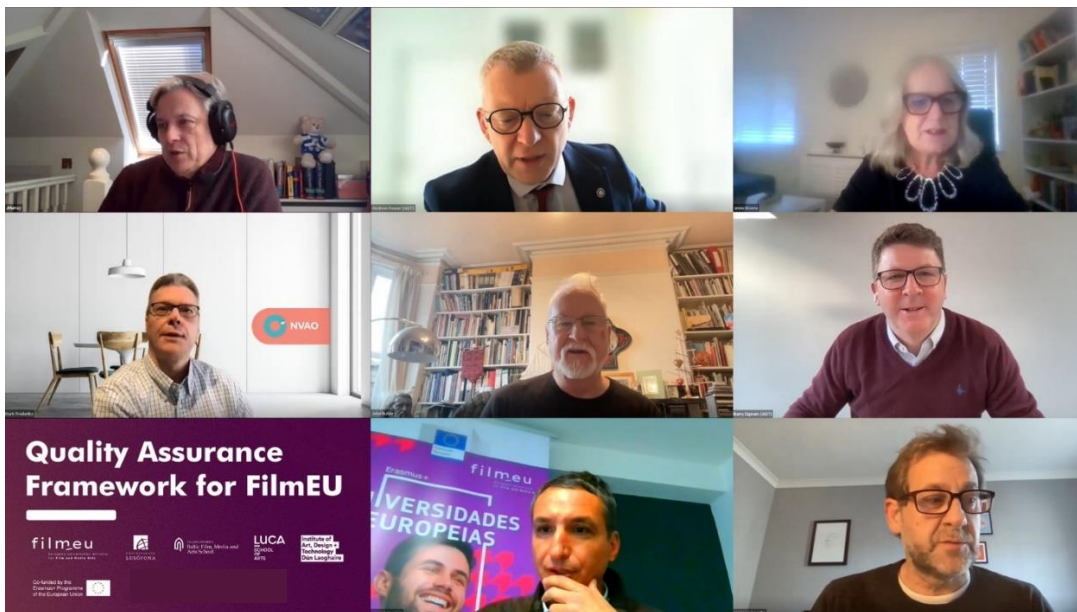


Fig. 5 Quality Assurance Framework for FilmEU, 23rd February 2022.

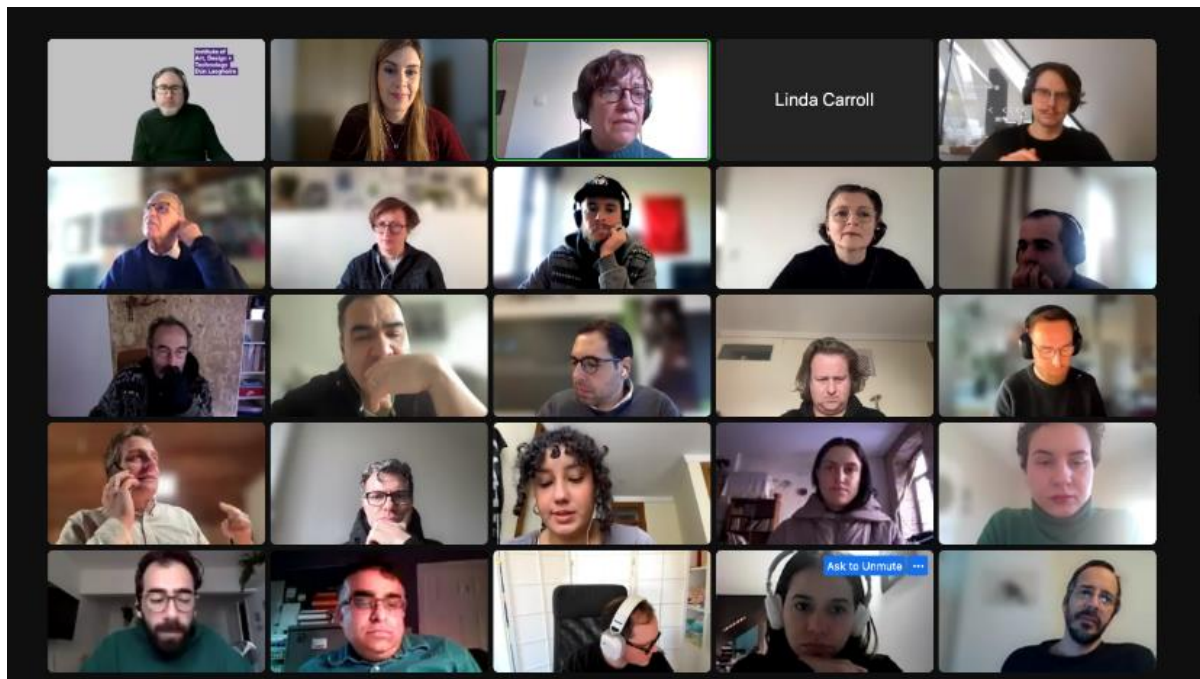


Fig. 7 FilmEU team, screenshot, 11th February 2023.
