Section 1 – Provider Information

This document presents an outline of the handbook guidelines used for highlighting a FilmEU MOOC. At the moment these are standalone modules.

1.1 Provider Details

FILMEU – The European University for Film and Media Arts, brings together four European Higher Education Institutions: Lusófona University from Lisbon (henceforth, LU), Portugal; BFM/TLU – Baltic Film and Media School, Tallinn University from Tallinn, Estonia (henceforth, BFM); LUCA School of Arts from Brussels, Belgium; and Dún Laoghaire Institute of Art Design and Technology, from Dublin (henceforth, IADT), Ireland. Together these institutions will be the provider of these MOOCs.

1.2 Contextual Information about the Provider and its other Programmes FilmEU offers a rich portfolio of inter-related programmes in a vibrant atmosphere of research, creativity, technology and production. Our programmes push discipline boundaries through creative collaboration and interaction. Our programmes in Film and Media already include the Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters in ReAnima, DocNomads and Kino Eyes, furthermore we are currently developing additional joint MA's in ReSound, FilMemory and Video games and an International BA in Film.

The strategy of the MOOC is to guide academics in their teaching and learning practices and curriculum design. This MOOC formally introduces **Samsara**, a challenge-based pedagogical framework devised to support our mission to foster excellence in film and media arts higher education. This framework is a pragmatic response to the need to transform teaching and learning practices within the context of rapidly changing social and technological conditions which affect the creation, production, distribution, and reception of audio-visual culture, industries, research, and education.

2.1 Module Goal

The Samsara framework has been designed to foster excellence, innovation, and collaboration in audio-visual artistic higher education. The methods selected and the goals we hope to achieve with Samsara emerged from an investigation into the conditions and practices underpinning contemporary film and media arts higher education generally and within the FilmEU Alliance.



2.2 Module Objective

The objective is that learners update their knowledge and skills in different pedagogical methodologies via the FilmEU Samsara model and eventually integrate this model into both new and existing curricular.

2.3 Rationale and Relevance for the Module

This Module is at an introductory level for staff within the FilmEU community to enhance their knowledge about different teaching practices. Different teaching and cultural backgrounds and experiences lead to a diversity of attitudes when facing a new project or pedagogical paradigm. We want teachers to feel a part of this project, and we recognise that the flexibility and motivation required to adapt to new curricula and methods must be perceived by teachers as an added value to their work and career.
