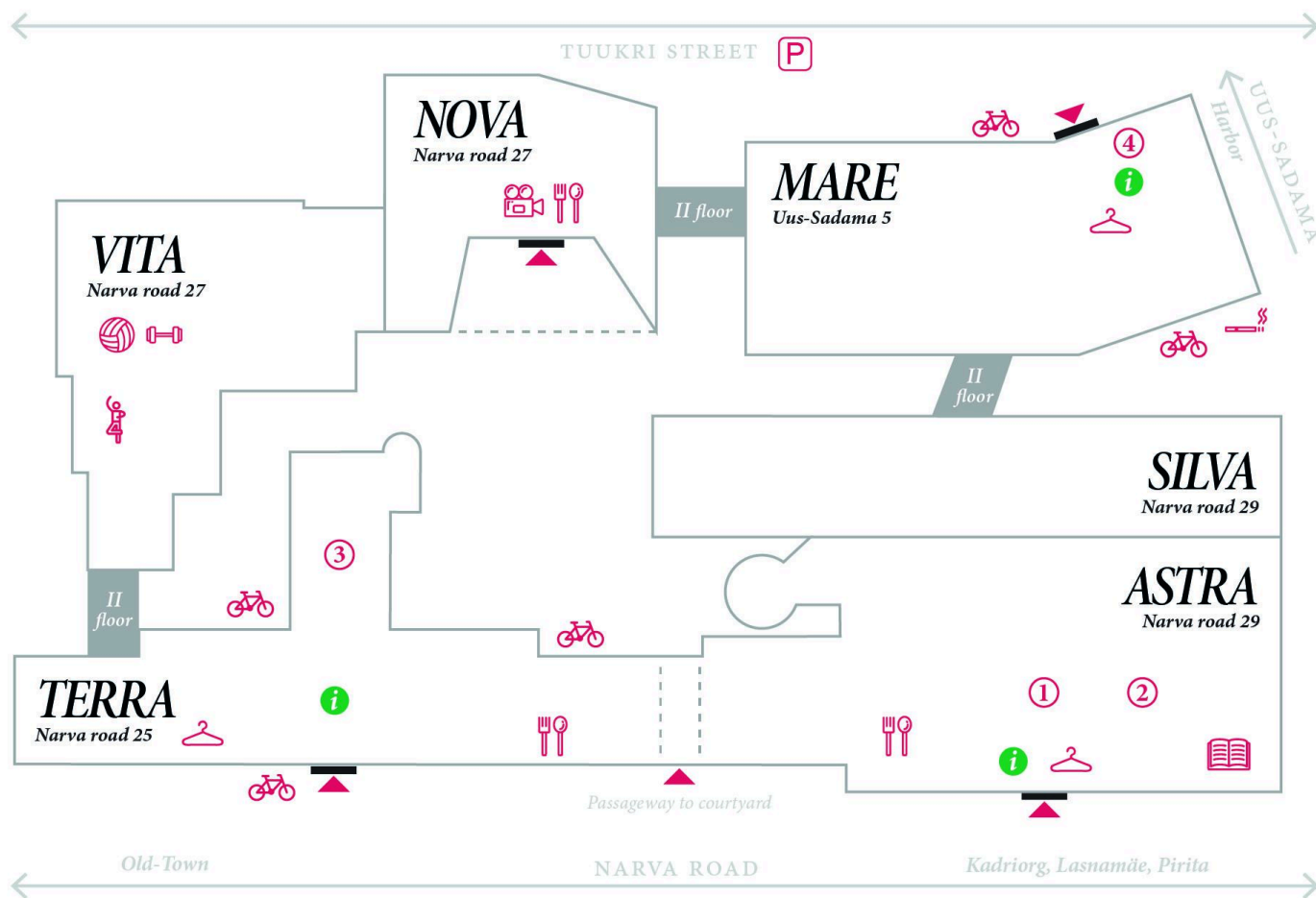
Event on-site registration

Accessibility and transportation

To and from the airport

Tallinn Airport is located just 4 km from the city centre which makes the airport easily accessible.

- **The bus stop** is located close to the arrivals area.

The main public transport connecting Tallinn Airport with Tallinn city are the public buses operated by Aktsiaselts Tallinna Linnatransport (TLT).

Bus nr. 2 (stopping by Tartu mnt) runs between city centre and the airport. See [the time table](#).

Bus nr. 15 (stopping at the terminal) runs between city centre and the airport. See [the time table](#).

- **The taxi** pick-up area is located just in front of the passenger terminal.

To the Tallinn University and around the town

Public transport

By tram

Tallinn University is the only university in Estonia that is accessible by tram. Take the tram no. 1 or 3 from the city centre or Kadriorg and get off at the Tallinn University stop.

By bus

Tallinn University is also accessible by bus: use the lines no. 1, 1A, 5, 8, 19, 29, 29A, 29B, 34A, 35, 38, 44, 51, 60, 63. Get off at the Uus-Sadama stop when heading in from the city centre, and at the Kreutzwaldi stop when coming from Pirita or Lasnamäe.

The public transportation timetable is available [HERE](#) and it is updated in real time.

Both the Ühiskaart (Tallinn's public transport card) and single tickets can be used on city buses.

For a single trip, purchase a QR ticket (2€) online or from the ticket machine in the waiting area by the airport's tram and bus stop. QR tickets are valid for one hour.

Tickets for single trips can also be purchased by tapping a contactless bank card against the validator inside the front door of the bus and tram.

If you would like to purchase an Ühiskaart and load money onto it, you can do so at R-kiosk in the public part of the terminal next to the Arrivals area. Prices and guide to buying a ticket is available [HERE](#).

Taxi

The cost of a taxi ride is approximately 0,5 EUR /per kilometre + starting fare 3,5 EUR. Most of the taxis will accept payments by card, but it's recommended to ask before sitting in.

If you're comfortable with using taxi apps, we recommend opting for either Bolt or Uber, both of which are affordable and convenient to use. Moreover, did you know that Bolt is a taxi service app that was originally born in Estonia and has now grown to become an international company that offers its services in various countries all over the world!

If you wish to have other options, it is possible to order a taxi via phone call:

Forus takso, phone +372 612 0000 (card payments accepted)

The taxi fares may slightly vary depending on the traffic and company.

WiFi-access

While on the Tallinn University campus, feel free to use the free high-speed WiFi-network TLU (no password) or if you wish, you're also welcome to use your institute's *eduroam* account at the university.
